## **Speakers**

### **Warren Beard, DVM**

Dr. Beard received his BS and DVM degrees from Texas A & M University in 1981 and 1983 respectively. He entered private practice in Dickinson, TX for two years before moving to Ohio State University to begin a residency in Equine Surgery. He completed his surgical residency and received a MS degree in Surgical Sciences in 1988. Following the residency he began a clinical instructorship as the emergency surgeon at Ohio State University for one year. Dr. Beard remained on faculty as an equine surgeon for 14 more years as an assistant and in 1995 as an associate professor before leaving to start a new position at Kansas State University in 2004.

### **Hans Coetzee,**

Dr. Hans Coetzee is an assistant professor in the Agricultural practices section at Kansas State University. He obtained his Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree from the University of Pretoria, South Africa in 1996. After graduation he worked for four years in mixed animal practice in Northern Ireland followed by 2 years in pharmaceutical research and development at Norbrook Laboratories Ltd. He received a specialist Certificate in Cattle Health and Production from the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (London) in 2000 and a doctorate in Veterinary Microbiology from Iowa State University in 2005.

### **Leslie Fox, DVM, MS**

Graduate of Michigan State University and did her residency/MS in internal medicine at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Dr. Fox was a faculty member for 11 years at the University of Florida before coming to Iowa State University in 2000. She holds Board-certification in internal medicine and limits her teaching and practice to small animal oncology.

### **Dan Goehl, DVM**

DVM at University of MO 1998. Dr. Goehl owns a mixed animal practice with his wife where he works with primarily stocker and cow/calf. Partner in Professional Beef Services, LLC which aides in data management and marketing. Board of Directors for AVC.

**Kevin Kazacos, DVM, PhD**

Dr. Kazacos is Professor of Veterinary Parasitology and Director of the Clinical Parasitology in the School of Veterinary Medicine, Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana. Dr. Kazacos received a BS in biology in 1971, a PhD in Parasitology in 1974 from University of Norte Dame, and a DVM from Purdue University in 1979. Since then he has been on the faculty at Purdue, where he teaches veterinary and graduate students, overseas diagnostic work in Parasitology, and conducts research on parasitic disease of animals and humans.

**Reed J Leiting DVM**

Dr. Reed Leiting is a graduate of Iowa State University. He practiced in Osage, Iowa for 4 years before moving to Worthington, Minnesota. He currently divides his time between mixed animal practice at the Veterinary Medical Center in Worthington and as Director of Nutrition for Propig. His primary focus is in the area of swine nutrition.

**LeMac' Morris**

Morris obtained a Bachelor of Science and his Veterinary degree from Oklahoma State University. He practiced veterinary medicine for over 20 years in a pre-dominantly small animal clinic located in the Arbuckle Mountains in southern Oklahoma. After leaving practice Dr. Morris received his Masters of Public Health from the University of Iowa. He currently is a companion animal field services veterinary for Fort Dodge Animal Health.

### **Annette M. O'Connor, B.V. Sc., M.V.Sc., D.V.Sc., MACVSc.**

Dr. O'Connor is currently Assistant Professor at the College of Veterinary Medicine, Iowa State University. Dr. O'Connor received a doctoral degree in Epidemiology from the University of Guelph, Canada in July 2002, Masters of Veterinary Science (DVM) in 1993 from the University of Sydney, Australia. Dr. O'Connor worked in a 90% large animal practice for 4 years prior to moving to Canada. Dr. O'Connor research program focuses on organisms of importance to cattle producers in Iowa i.e. BVDV and pinkeye.

### **Gary Sides, PhD**

Gary Sides is a beef and feedlot nutritionist with Pfizer Animal Health. He has been with Pfizer since 2003. Sides has extensive beef industry nutrition experience, compiling 20 years with organizations such as Intervet/Hoechst-Roussel Vet, Cargill Animal Nutrition and Moorman Manufacturing Company.
